Openness = Opportunity = Outreach

Being open about yourself is often a difficult thing to do. It may seem strange, or even counterintuitive but openness for a pastor isn't necessarily natural. In fact, like other pastors I have spoken with I have at times been a bit hesitant to be open with the career path I am on. This has been especially true while on vacation or traveling. When someone would ask, "What do you do?" I always answered, but usually with a bit of dread. Generally I was looking forward to some 'rest' from pastoral demands or theological discussion. That doesn't happen when someone finds out you are a pastor. Almost without fail they go into a discussion about their own struggles or those of someone else's. I imagine it's much the same for doctors.

On the other hand, already in the short time we have been traveling, I have been amazed at the opportunity that openness has brought. One such incident came about as I was sitting at a Chevrolet dealership speaking with the woman who was helping us rent a vehicle. Talking to her about our situation I had the opportunity to share about the work we will be doing in Alaska and why we will be doing it. After several minutes of conversation it became evident a young lady at another counter had been listening in on the conversation. This gave rise to sharing the Gospel of Christ with someone I would have never met if it had not been for the transmission going out and more importantly for my openness about who I am.

So many people are looking for hope and peace in this world. And Satan readily takes advantage of our doubts about ourselves or our own selfish desires (even those for 'rest') to hide the Gospel from people around us. I don't like to think about how many people missed an opportunity to hear about the love of Jesus simply because I didn't feel like talking about it from time to time.

Lately, I have certainly had many more opportunities to share His message with people I never knew. But, admittedly those opportunities abound with each of us every day. Each hour we have an opportunity to meet new people or expand relationships with those we already know. Being open about ourselves as forgiven sinners gives rise to outreach: reaching out to others that they may know the amazing grace of God. I don't know what God will do with that young lady I met, but I know a seed was sown. Praise be to God!

How much does it cost to send a missionary to AK?

The question of how much money we need to raise and how it is spent has been asked several times, and I am sure many of you would like to know. So here is a breakdown:

Family Living Expenses (Housing, Utilities, Gas, Food, etc.)	\$60,000
[living expenses are 30-40% higher in AK]	
Concordia Plans (Medical Ins, Retirement, Disability, etc.)	\$25,000
Ministry (Travel, Conferences, Materials, Postage, Paper, etc.)	\$10,000
Contingency (To cover an emergency or unexpected need)	\$5,000
<u>Moving Costs (First year expense only)</u>	<u>\$25,000</u>
	\$125,000 TOTAL GOAL

We are **currently HALF WAY** to our goal for the first year. We will move to AK once the first year goal is reached.

Unfortunately we continue to pay self employment taxes which comes out of our living expenses.
